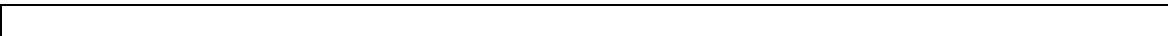

#### The Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice

In order to graduate from Pikeville College, students must complete the Pikeville College “Core Requirements” in the liberal arts and a major (see page two) with Pikeville College.

History Sequence, choose <b>either</b> HIS 221/222 (World Civilization) <b>or</b> HIS 225/226 (American History) (6)	Either of the following sequence will meet the core requirement: HIS 106-107 Western Culture I and II, HIS 104-105 A History of Europe (through 17 <sup>th</sup> century and to the present), <b>or</b> HIS 108-109 History of the U.S. I and II; in addition, students majoring in history or education will need to take World Civilization at Pikeville College.

### TRANSFER NOTES:

- Only courses with a “C” grade or better will transfer. Other general requirements for degrees awarded by Pikeville College are listed in the Pikeville College Catalog.
- General Requirements for a bachelor degree at Pikeville College include, but are not limited to the following:
  - Must complete 50% of the major and 25% of the total hours (128) at Pikeville College
  - Must earn 60 credit hours from a four-year institution
  - Must complete 42 hours of upper level (300 and 400) courses
  - Other requirements may be found in the Pikeville College Catalog
